Visit to Dr. Willmar Schwabe Manufacturing Unit

Sudhanshu Mishra

As we reached Dr. Willmar Schwabe ,we first visited their hall. Then Dr. Sudhanshu Mishra Scientific Advisor to Pharmacopeial Committee and Author of two Pharmacopoeia were introduced to all students. He gave a brief idea of diverse subject like manufacturing technique, quality control or assurance & quality analysis , cultivation & quality of herbs, homoeopathic market & modern marketing techniques. A slide show was shown to us & many of our students interacted with Dr. Sudhanshu Mishra & he answered all queries of students.

Students were divided into 3 groups each of 28 students. Every students was ready with surgical caps & surgical masks at the venue.

The rooms we visited were as followed:

1. The Raw Material Rooms:

The room for the raw material were all the drugs in their crude form were kept. Fresh & dried raw material were kept separately.

2. The Finished Product Room:

The finished product room where all types of medicines, tablets, ointments , biochmic remedies etc. were kept.

Stoke is arranged in alphabetical order,so it is easy to identify.

3. The Labelling Room:

Here all we saw different kinds of labels i.e. labels for medicinal bottles.The labels consisted of manufacturing date, license number, expiry date, price, etc. Dr.Khaladkar guided us.

4. Room For Potentiation And Tablet Making Room:

There we saw an electric triturator in which the biochemic remedies were kept for



potentisation. The information regarding the tablet making machine was given to us by Dr.Shitole.

5.Ointment Making Room:

In this room there was a water bath in which the ointments were prepared after which there was a stirrer, weighing machine ,etc. the specific gravity , viscosity & all essential things were noted.

6.Washing Room:

In this room all the instruments were kept for washing & an oven was there for sterilization of these instruments.

7.Room For Syrups:

In this room all the prepared syrups were kept in large stainless steel containers. The processes like maceration & percolation were explained to us by Dr.Khaladkar

With this it was end phase of the laboratory. Last but not the least there was thanks giving speech given by one of the student along with one small photo session with all the teachers as well as the non teaching staff .The students learnt various Pharmacological processes intended to make good qualitative medicine. Everything was packed up by 6:30 evening after which everyone dispersed to their respective places.

As we reached HPL , students were divided into **2** groups each of **23** students.

Our first visit was to Chemical laboratory:

- Thin Layer Chromatography (TLC) was introduced to us. In this technique non-volatile mixtures are separated.
- It is performed on aluminum foil of size 20x20 which is coated with a thin layer of adsorbent material usually silica gel.
- After the sample has been applied on the plate a solvent or solvent mixture is drawn up the plate via capillary action. Because different analysts ascend the TLC plate at different rates, separation is achieved.
- Thin Layer Chromatography can be used to monitor the progress of reaction, identify compounds present in a given mixture, & determine the purity of a substance.

Our second visit was to Museum:






Our third visit was to Pharmacognosy Laboratory:




